

National Chung Cheng University Provisions Governing Scholarships for Foreign Students

Approved by the 295th Administration Commentary Meeting on Nov. 22, 2004

I. National Chung Cheng University (hereinafter referred to as the University) hereby set down the provisions to promote the international popularity, attract excellent foreign students to learn in the university, and make the university internationally-oriented.

II. Sources of scholarships:

1. From the annual budget compiled by the university.
2. From donations or endowment.

III. Recipients of scholarships:

Applicants shall conform to the following:

1. Foreign students as stipulated in article 2 of National Chung Cheng University Provisions Governing Admissions of Foreign Students.
2. Foreign students study for degrees of the university (including multi-national double degrees).

IV. Qualifications for application:

(I) Foreign students applying for admissions.

(II) Registered students:

1. Graduates shall register minimally 4 credits with the average over 75 in each semester of the previous academic year; under-graduates shall at least register minimally 6 credits with the average over 70 in each semester of the previous academic year.
2. Students who have no scores from the previous term in the duration of writing master's or doctor's theses shall apply with their supervisors' recommendations and research achievements including their writing plans of theses and publications).
3. Good conduct records and having no record of offense.

V. Application time:

Both newly-admitted and registered students shall apply to the General Affairs Division of the Office of Academic Affairs of the University for the Scholarships of the next academic year prior to March 31 every year.

VI. Amount, time and quota of scholarships awarded

(I) The scholarships are classified into full and partial fellowships, including:

1. Tuition and fees waiver
2. Accommodation fees waiver (including accommodation fees in winter and summer vacations in the university)
3. The upper limit for every doctor candidate is 50,000 Taiwan dollars per academic year, for master candidate 40,000, bachelor candidate 30,000; and the scholarships will be divided into two equal halves and awarded in the first and second semester.

(II) Fellowships will be awarded on the basis of the academic year, with the duration of one year, and all eligible applicants may apply every year.

(III) The total quotas of persons will vary with the annual budgets of the university.

(IV) Lists of recipients of foreign students will be disclosed on the website of the Office of Academic Affairs and they will be notified via official letters.

Recipients shall return their letters of consent within two weeks after receiving the official letters (in accordance with the postmarks), those who fail to return the letters of consent within the stipulated duration and have no consent of the university shall be viewed as relinquishment.

VII. Examination methods of scholarships:

The recipients and amount of the scholarships are subject to the Examination Committee of Foreign Student Scholarships of the university.

The Examination Committee of Foreign Student Scholarships comprises of 7 to 9 members. The dean and R&D chief are rightful members, and other members shall firstly be recommended by the Office of Academic Affairs and secondly approved by the President. The meeting shall be convened by the dean.

VIII. If a foreign recipient suspends his/her schooling or drops out, the scholarship shall be terminated to release.

IX. Issues not included in the provisions shall be proceeded in accordance with related stipulations of the university.

X. This provisions, as well as any revision, shall be released and come into effect after it is passed at an administration meeting and being submitted to the President.
